CONSTITUTION & BY-LAWS



IDAHO
UNITED MOTORCYCLE CLUB
INTERNATIONAL

CONSTITUTION OF THE IDAHO UNITED MOTORCYCLE CLUB INTERNATIONAL

Article I

This Club shall be known as the IDAHO UNITED MOTORCYCLE CLUB INTERNATIONAL (U.M.C.I.). The Club insignia shall be as illustrated in Article VIII of this Constitution. this Club insignia shall serve to identify one Club member to another while traveling or attending events and shall be lent for no other purpose; public or private. A lifetime identification card shall be issued to each member.

Article II

Members shall be riders of motorcycles or motorcycle enthusiasts. Membership will be limited to those persons who have attained the age of forty (40) years and shall accept the Constitution and By-Laws of the U.M.C.I. there shall be no restrictions as to race, creed, sex or citizenship.

Article III

The Club is basically of a correspondence nature with no Clubhouse, or other formal organization as a locality Club would have. The Club's purpose is making new friends and meeting with old ones.

Article IV

There shall be no dues or fees for membership in the Idaho U.M.C.I. as a nationwide endeavor. Members having reached the age of reason are considered to be self-sufficient and self-determining. Each member shall have equal rights and responsibilities in Club matters. There shall be officers at two levels: State/Provincial Representative and Area or Local Representative. These Reps will volunteer their services.

Article V

The Club neither promotes, endorses or opposes any causes, excluding safety and image and shall affiliate with no other organization, except U.M.C.I..

Article VI

Until such time as the membership shall determine otherwise, general correspondence in Club matters shall be addressed to the current State Rep of the Idaho U.M.C.I.

Article VII (Deleted)

Article VIII

The upper portion of the chief is a field of white with "IDAHO" in black letters. The lower portion of the chief is a field of gold on a blue background and the letters U.M.C.I. in black signifying UNITED MOTORCYCLE CLUB INTERNATIONAL. The dexter flank being a sunrise with silhouettes of two motorcyclists denoting the sunrise of a new day. The sinister flank being the words "RIDE BESIDE ME BE MY FRIEND" in white letters on a black field, representing the phrase "Don't walk in front of me, I might follow. Don't walk behind me, we might not meet. Walk beside me be my friend." the base point is white with "OVER 40" in black.



BY-LAWS OF THE IDAHO MOTORCYCLE CLUB INTERNATIONAL

Article I

This Club shall be known as the Idaho United Motorcycle Club International (U.M.C.I.) and is a member of the U.M.C.I. The Club insignia shall be as illustrated in Article VIII of the Constitution. This Club insignia shall serve to identify one Club member to another while traveling or attending events and shall not be lent, given or sold to any non-member for any purpose; public or private.

Article II

The United M.C. International will be the instrument for uniting individual States and Provinces on an International level. The mail purpose being to make friends through correspondence. Each State and Province being a separate Club will be joined together on an International level through membership in the U.M.C.I. TO BECOME A MEMBER IN THE U.M.C.I., an individual State or Province will be required to accept this State/Provincial Constitution and By-Laws.

Article III

Section 1 - Purpose

The Club is basically a friendship Club. Visits are made between members, personal friendships are made and events are planned. Club activities are as many and varied as are the members themselves. Activities range from local "get togethers" to Area, State/Provincial and International events. States and Provinces put out their own newsletter..

Section 2 - Members

Members are motorcycles enthusiasts who have attained their 40th birthday (spouse of member need not be 40) and accept the Constitution and By-Laws of the U.M.C.I. They are riders or people with a common interest in motorcycles. Members not willing to follow the Constitution and By-Laws, will be considered having removed themselves from membership in the U.M.C.I. and therefore their names may be removed from the membership list. The removal from the membership list will be at the discretion of the State or Provincial and International Reps.

Section 3 - How to Join

Information on joining a State/Provincial U.M.C.I. Club may be obtained by asking any U.M.C.I. member. they can put you in touch with your State/Provincial or Area Rep or you can write to the current U.M.C.I. Rep. Your inquiry will be forwarded to the appropriate person.

Article IV

Section 1 - Dues

There shall be no established annual dues or fees for membership. The expenses of operation for the Club will be paid by voluntary membership donations.

Section 2 - Money

All U.M.C.I. moneys will be deposited in a non-interest bearing bank account under the Club name and must be in the State, Provincial or Area Rep's name. If a two-signature check is used, one of those signatures must be the Rep's name. The State or Provincial Rep, or duly appointed Rep, is authorized to receive donations, pay Club expenses and/or handle financial matters or funds in any manner. The State or Provincial Clubs may support the operation of the International organization from donations. No Area, State/Provincial or International Rep may obligate or encumber the Club to any indebtedness.

Section 3 - Expenses

Reps at all levels will only be reimbursed for Club correspondence and Club communication. The Reps will not be reimbursed for travel, lodging and/or personal expenses. The State, Provincial and International Reps will be required to issue a financial statement at least once a year. The International statement will go to the State and Provincial Reps. The State and Provincial statements will go the Local or Area Reps.

Article V

Section 1 - U.M.C.I. Rep

Only duties are to coordinate information and events at the International level and be a correspondence point for the Club at the International level. Authority will only come by majority vote of State and Provincial Reps within the limits of the Constitution and its By-Laws. The International Rep may be replaced or removed by majority vote of the State and Provincial Reps. The International Rep may choose his or her successor with the approval of a majority vote of the State and Provincial Reps.

Section 2 - State and Provincial Reps

State and Provincial Reps are the governing body for the Club and are also the Board of Directors for the U.M.C.I. Their authority will come by a majority vote of the Area or Local Reps in their State or Province, within the limits of the Constitution and its' By-Laws. Their duties will be to coordinate information and events at the State and Provincial level and be a correspondence point at this level. They may be removed or replaced by a majority vote of the Area or Local Reps. The State and Provincial Reps may choose their successor with the approval of a majority of the Area or Local Reps.

Note: A Regional Rep may be desirable. If so, one of the State and Provincial Reps could serve in that capacity for coordination and correspondence in that region.

Section 3 - Area and Local Reps

Area and Local Reps will be the governing body at the Area level with the approval and consent of the active membership in majority and within the limits of the Constitution and its By-Laws. Their duties will be to coordinate information and events at the local level and be a correspondence point at that level. they may be removed or replaced by a majority vote of the active members. The Area and Local Reps may choose their successor with the approval of a majority of the area votes cast.

Article VI

Section 1 - Identification

Each State and Provincial Rep shall be responsible for issuing lifetime identification membership cards with the Club name and Insignia and a copy of the ?Constitution and By-Laws to each member. The identification card shall be valid as long as membership is being held in the U.M.C.I. If a persons name is being removed from the membership list as per article III Sec. 2, the membership card will no longer be valid. All membership applications will be processed at the State/Provincial level. Membership lists will be kept at the State/Provincial level. The International Rep or State/Provincial Rep will arrange for the name of a supplier of the Club insignia-bearing patches and pins.

Article VIII

Any State or Province that wants a list of their activities and events circulated internationally, must have that information to the International Rep by Feb. 28th of each year. The International Rep will have this material printed and distribution ready by March 31st of each year. Each state or Province will be responsible to supply sufficient funds to cover the cost of printing, postage and handling.

Article IX

The Active voting membership in majority will be the final absolute authority in any decisions rendered pertaining to problems that may arise in Club matters. This must be done within the Constitution and its By-Laws. Any member may vote. Notice of alterations or changes in the Constitution or By-Laws shall be published in the newsletter at least sixty (60) days prior to a vote. All votes on the above shall be by written ballot.
