Hello everyone!! Rick Killebrew here. As your State Representative, I was reminded by our Editor, Karen Burgus, that I have a Newsletter Report/Article/"Rant" due. So, as my first Official Action, I offer you the following: newly appointed

My wife, Carla, and I have been associated with UMCI since 2011, with our first ride being to Osoyoos, Canada. Our first exposure to UMCI was a year earlier when, upon an invitation from Dick Burnam, we visited what I believe was the 2010 International Rally in John Day, OR. It was at the Grant County Fair Grounds we saw folks smiling together, having fun together while riding, sharing stories and lies, and having meals together. It was there that we first participated in the long running tradition of Ice Cream together. Everyone "Together" is what we saw and a "Together" that we wanted to be a part of.

As we continue our journey together, let us first give Larry Phelps our warm thanks for having led us these past couple of years. I believe Larry's vision and message to/for us has been "Together". I heard him say it often and always with sincerity. As we move forward, I will be reaching back to Larry and his predecessors (Dick, Lonny, and Richard) for guidance and direction.

As I begin my tenure as your State Rep, I'd like to adopt a mantra as we ride forward. A mantra that continues in the same atmosphere of "Together" especially emphasized when included in the phrase, "Together we stand, divided we fall". This is part of the memorable phrase spoken by Patrick Henry in a speech he made in 1799. In a more complete content, Patrick Henry's quote reads,

"Let us trust God, and our better judgment to set us right hereafter. United we stand, divided we fall. Let us not split into factions which must destroy the union upon which our existence hangs."

This year's State Rally was a success. I was glad to have been involved and to have been able to help Larry in its success. There were 65 riders and enthusiasts in attendance, which included sixteen riders from Canada. The makeup of attendees is 13-Individuals and 26-Couples. Each participant received 3-Raffle Tickets and admission to dinner on Thursday night (Salad, baked sliced ham, baked potato w/trimmings, Julie Fretwell's Cowboy Caviar, and my Mango Salsa (a.k.a. Ham Aide), all followed up with ice cream sundaes and brownies). The sale of Raffle Tickets (\$1 ea. And 6-for-\$5) brought in an additional \$115. 50/50 Ticket sales brought in \$778. After Tuesday's and Thursday's 50/50 pay-outs of \$280 and \$438 respectively, the event's expenses were tallied, along with our covering one-half or \$250 of the purchase of the Club's new-to-us cargo/storage trailer, we returned an additional \$400 during the 50/50 drawing. Thanks to all that came, rode with us, as well as dined and had fun with us. This year was great, and next year will be even better.

Now, with our 2023 Idaho State Rally behind us and having celebrated another glorious Independence Day, we turn our focus to the 2023 UMCI International Rally (July 17-21) in Cashmere, WA, followed by the 37th Annual Coos Bay Camp Out (Aug 23-27) in Myrtle Point, OR. Canada, Washington, and Oregon have supported our event(s) and we need to support theirs. Please join us at these and other upcoming events.
